-- Rules for the NYS USBC, Inc., 2016 Annual Meeting --

1. *Roberts Rules of Order Newly Revised* shall govern the procedures for the Board of Directors and Delegates at this Annual Meeting, provided they do not conflict with the Bylaws of the New York State USBC, Inc.
2. The meeting shall convene at 1:00 p.m., Saturday, June 4, 2016.
3. Delegates shall be in their seats at least *five* minutes prior to the scheduled starting time. Only registered Delegates are seated. Delegates arriving late should report to the Sergeant-at-Arms for registration and seating.
4. Delegate badges shall be worn in full view during meeting hours.
5. Visitors and guests shall be seated in a designated area by the Sergeant-at-Arms.
6. The Credentials Report is given prior to the Legislative Report.
7. To be recognized, a Delegate shall advance to a microphone and address the Chair. The Delegate's Full name shall be clearly stated along with the association represented, Adult or Youth.
8. A Delegate shall be permitted to speak only *twice* on any question, limiting each discussion to *two* minutes. The exception to this rule is at the discretion of the Chair.
9. All motions shall be stated in the affirmative.
10. The use of cell phones and beepers, making or receiving calls, is prohibited while the meeting is in session.
11. To expedite the business of the meeting, Delegates shall give courteous and full attention to the Speaker having the floor.
12. The Chair may call an intermission during the session.
13. The Chair may deviate from the agenda.
14. Exceptions to these rules may be made at the discretion of the Chair.

--- REPORT OF THE NYS USBC OFFICE ---

FROM ASSOCIATION MANAGER MIKE PETTINELLA:

They say that “time flies” when you’re having fun.

As we gather here this weekend, almost five years have passed since the formation of the NYS USBC. For me, taking part in the advancement in our state bowling association has been a fulfilling combination of fun and hard work — the latter by our officers, directors, staff and a large number of volunteers who have displayed unwavering dedication to the sport of bowling in New York State.

I think we can look back with pride and a sense of accomplishment on the progress of our state tournaments — at all skill and age levels — and on the NYS USBC’s commitment to providing scholarship opportunities to our young people, to sponsoring coaching classes for those interested in teaching the fundamentals of the sport and to giving to our charitable organizations as a result of the generosity of our members.

While it’s nice to reflect on what we have done, it’s more important to look forward — developing ways to “do more with less” (as membership continues to decline) by connecting with those throughout the state who wish to contribute to bowling’s success.

In closing, I would like to congratulate President Roger Buckman on the successful completion of his first year in office and thank you to the NYS USBC Directors for their support. Also, I big THANK YOU to all those who have assisted the NYS USBC over the past five years. And please accept our invitation to participate in our tournaments and other programs as we work together for *A Future for the Sport* of bowling.

2016 USBC ANNUAL CONVENTION – LAS VEGAS, NEV.

LAS VEGAS – Delegates voted to increase the national dues cap and also voted on three board positions as the 2016 United States Bowling Congress Convention and Annual Meeting concluded Friday (April 29) at The Orleans.

Delegates approved bylaws amendments allowing national dues to increase up to a maximum of \$15, and also approved amendments requiring non-merged local and non-merged state associations to be merged by Aug. 1, 2018. They rejected an amendment to allow state associations to have delegates for affiliate associations. Bylaws amendments required two-thirds of the voting delegates to approve to pass.

Leading up to the USBC Convention, the USBC Board asked associations to support the dues cap increase amendment and set a schedule if it was approved – national dues will not increase for the 2016-2017 season, national dues would increase to \$13 for the 2017-2018 season and national dues would not increase again before the 2022-2023 season.

Delegates also approved a tournament rule amendment requiring bowlers to report any previous tournament adjustment/erate unless tournament rules state otherwise, but rejected two league rule amendments. League and tournament amendments required a majority vote to pass.

Five candidates ran for the three open positions on the USBC board. **Current USBC President Frank Wilkinson of Staten Island, New York**, incumbent director Mark Martin of Waterford, Michigan, and Jeffrey Ussery of Tonganoxie, Kansas, were slated by the USBC Nominating Committee, while incumbent director Anthony Colangelo of Twin Falls, Idaho, and Yvette Davis of Charlotte, N.C., ran from the floor.

Wilkinson (701 votes), Martin (629) and Ussery (536) were elected on the first ballot. Colangelo received 355 votes while Davis received 259 votes. Wilkinson, Martin and Ussery each will begin a three-year term starting Aug. 1.

Kendra Gaines of Orlando, Florida, also will join the board for the 2016-2017 season. Gaines, the general manager at Aloma Bowl and a former Team USA member, was elected by Team USA athletes earlier this year. She replaces Andrew Cain, who termed out this year.

The International Bowling Campus Youth Committee members also were determined earlier this year. Melissa McDaniel Morrow of Raleigh, North Carolina, who served as the chair of the IBC Youth Committee last season, was approved by the boards of the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America and USBC for a new three-year term. Morrow will be joined on the IBC Youth Committee by Chrissie Kent of Newark, New York, and Kelly Marlin of Murfreesboro, Tennessee.

During the convention, Bowl for the Cure® and Bowlers To Veterans Link (BVL) presentations highlighted USBC's support of charitable causes during the last year.

Through donations from local and state associations, plus merchandise sales and online donations, Bowl for the Cure® presented a \$618,030.84 check to Susan G. Komen®. Bowl for the Cure® is a year-round fundraising initiative sponsored by USBC in partnership with Susan G. Komen®. Go online to BowlfortheCure.com to learn more.

BVL, which provides recreational and therapeutic programs and services to brighten the days of America's active duty and veteran service men and women, announced it made a total donation of just over \$909,000 to the Department of Veterans Affairs because of contributions made during the 2014-2015 season. Founded in 1942, BVL has raised more than \$45 million.

Requires bowler to report any previous tournament adjustment/rerate unless tournament rules state otherwise.

Bylaws (two-third votes needed)

Amendment No. B 1 – Accepted (623 accept, 287 reject)

USBC National Bylaws

Article II, Purposes

Section B, Chartering State and Local Bowling Associations

Requires non-merged local associations to be merged by August 1, 2018.

USBC CONVENTION SEMINAR SUMMARIES

The National USBC annual convention was held in Las Vegas, Nev., April 26-29 at The Orleans Hotel & Convention Center. The theme of this year's convention was "Together We Can" meaning if we are unified in all of our efforts at all levels operations will become smoother and allow us to grow the sport.

Report from Roger Buckman, NYS USBC President:

Rules:

The seminar was designed to identify those bowlers who use the rules to their advantage to increase their odds of winning: Rule 319d • Requirement to report prior prize winnings over \$600 in last 12 months; Rule 319e • Adjustment of entering average if tournament average of 21 games or more is 15 pins or higher; Professional "Sandbagger": You bowl league only one night a week but spend every weekend bowling in tournaments that are within 500 miles of your home; The league average you enter with is 150 and 99 games but you have seven other averages all over 200 all with 20 games; Tough Condition Leagues.

USBC Recruitment:

The seminar was designed to assess the current state of your board and do the following:

Identify the gaps in volunteer skills of your board members; Improve, diversify, and evaluate your Board of Directors skill sets; Create a plan to cross-train and share with others in order to provide a stronger board; Ability to become stronger; Reduce the burden on the association manager; Create back up support; Increase awareness of the association's purpose; Working together to achieve a shared purpose. Goals: Develop action plans to move forward and create accountability; Celebrate your local association successes.

Information Technology:

The seminar was designed to broaden your horizons on the methods available to communicate and deliver your association's message of who and what you are: BOWL.com for average verification; SMART portal for youth scholarships; Tournament management software; WinLabs 12 (Available the second half of 2016); Membership database with all of our history.

President and Vice President Networking:

The forum for this seminar was small (10 people). All Presidents or Vice Presidents seated together sharing success stories that have worked in their respective associations as well as meeting and hopefully developing a group network to take back to their association. Discussion focused on awards, recruiting, promotion and marketing, idea-sharing.

Report from Liz DeHart, NYS USBC Vice President:

State Association Networking - Robin Marshall

All State board members were invited to this opportunity to discuss topics related to State Association service. Topics included ways that the State Association could help their Local Associations, and ways each State can recognize their members, i.e., Hall of fame, Scholarships, Awards and Achievements. And how does each State promote their Championship tournaments?

USBC Recruitment - Robin Marshall, Ben Brose, Mike Larsen

The topic of the discussion was "Why Recruit?" By recruiting new members you have the ability to become stronger, reduce the burden put on Association Managers and obtain new members for leagues. Having a recruitment plan in place is vital for success as we build a future for the sport.

President and Vice President Networking

President and Vice Presidents from around the country came together. How to recruit new Board members, how to encourage "lazy" board members, Financial oversight practices, and how to encourage our Youth to grow to become Adult bowlers. As the discussion progressed, we came to realize that all the States — no matter the size — face very similar situations.

Youth Membership Services – Gary Brown, Roger Noordhoek

This seminar was designed to help build stronger relationship with our bowling centers by providing outstanding youth services. Topics included products, awards, services, and achievements. The consensus was that we need to do and give more to our youth to secure a future for our sport.

The committee met on August 8, 2015, at the DoubleTree in Binghamton, New York to audit the financial position of the NYS USBC Inc.

We conducted a thorough audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements for the fiscal year August 1, 2014 to July 31, 2015 were free of material misstatement. Our audits included examining on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.

It is the opinion of this Finance & Budget Committee that the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material aspects, the financial position of the NYS USBC as of July 31, 2015.

The Finance Committee recommends with the Board of Directors approval the following distributions that were obtained through Pathways committee fundraisers;

Sloan Kettering Memorial Hospital - \$10,000 (toward Breast Cancer, Prostate Cancer, and Juvenile Cancers).

Roswell Park Cancer Institute - \$10,000 (Same breakdown as above).

BVL - \$2,000

Scholarships (YES Contribution) - \$3,000

At that time the Committee had also prepared a General Budget for the year 2015-16.

Independent Accountant’s Review Report

--- REPORT OF THE TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE ---

New York State USBC bowlers love to test their skills in tournament competition and the 2015-16 season proved to be a showcase for numerous outstanding team and individual performances. All told, the NYS USBC's adult championship tournaments drew just shy of 4,000 entrants — a commendable number considering that membership has declined in recent years.

We strive to run fair and efficient tournaments, and this wouldn't be possible without the help of all the local USBC association leaders and volunteers who gave of their time and talents to work at the tournaments. A heartfelt "thank you" to all of those who assisted us in running these events — and also we say thanks to the bowling center proprietors, managers and staff members who helped make these tournaments successful.

Information about all of the NYS USBC tournaments can be found at www.bowlny.com. Following is a summary of tournaments from the 2015-16 bowling season:

WOMEN'S SENIOR SINGLES, Valley Bowling Center, Waverly, August 2015 — Hosted by the SAW Valley USBC, the two-weekend, six-game Singles tournament drew 575 entries in the six age classifications — about 25 more than the previous year. Two bowlers who won their respective age classification — Karen Brouwere (Corning USBC BA) and Pamela Burns (Southern Tier USBC — will be competing in the USBC Senior Championships in Las Vegas in August. **The 2016 Women's Senior Singles tournament in August is set for Crystal Lanes in Corning and another fine turnout is expected.**

OPEN SENIOR SINGLES, Lakeview Lanes, Fulton, October 2015— A total of 127 doubles teams and 234 singles competed in the two-weekend Doubles & Singles tournament, hosted by the Fulton USBC BA. Five bowlers, who placed either first or second in the Six-Game Combine in their respective divisions, will be competing in the USBC Senior Championships. They are Robert Mossotti (Syracuse USBC BA), Ed DeSio (Lake Ontario USBC BA), John Maloy (Tri-County NY USBC), Mike Tryniski (Fulton USBC BA) and William Young (Auburn USBC BA). **This October, the tournament will be at Kingpin's Alley Family Fun Center in South Glens Falls.**

MASTERS, Lighthouse Lanes, Oswego, March 2016— Nick Miseno (Schenectady USBC BA) defeated Mark Scuderi (Rochester USBC BA) in the two-game finals to claim the \$2,000 first prize. The tournament drew 116 bowlers after switching to a "no re-entry" format for the first time in several years. Miseno also earned a paid entry to the 2017 USBC Masters. **In 2017, the Masters is scheduled for March 4 at Farmingdale Lanes on Long Island.**

QUEENS, AMF Empire Lanes, April 2016— Make it a "three-peat" for Shannon Sellens (Long Island USBC) as she defeated Traci Spanitz (Rochester USBC WBA) in the finals for her third consecutive NYS Queens Open Division title. In the Classified Division, Dena Alberti (Rochester USBC BA) prevailed. Once again, we had a great turnout — 102 bowlers in the Open Division and 29 in the Classified Division. **In 2017, Rapids Bowling Center in Niagara Falls will host the tournament on April 22.**

WOMEN, AMF Dewey Garden Lanes, Bowl-A-Roll Lanes, Rochester, April-May 2016 — Although entries were down by about 50 teams, scoring was way up as there were 80 series of 700 or better, including an 811 by Jessica Aiezza (Schenectady Scotia USBC WBA), and two 300 games — Heather Stewart (Rochester USBC BA) and Aiezza. Prize checks will be mailed by mid-June. **In 2017, the tournament will be held at Tonawanda Bowling Center in Tonawanda.**

OPEN, AMF Pin-O-Rama Lanes, Utica — In a return to Utica for the first time since 2009, 229 teams (up from 200 last year) participated and had a field day on the Kegel Bourbon Street oil pattern with 12 perfect games and nine 800 series. The prize fund will be paid out by early-June. **The 2017 tournament is scheduled for Ideal Bowling Center in the Binghamton area.**

--- REPORT OF THE YOUTH COMMITTEE ---

New York State Scholarship Tournament (Kathy Leitgeb, State Tournament Manager)

Our joint function with the NYS BPA ... All Handicap Tournament, a total of 79 centers participated with 3,490 entries, which advanced 779 juniors to the regional level. The top 60 boys and girls grades 9 and above and the top 80 boys and girls grades 8 and under competed at the State Championship tournament in Kingston on April 26. The tournament crowned eight state champions and awarded \$10,250 in scholarships.

New York State Team Tournament (Tom Solimine Sr., State Tournament Manager)

Regional entries total 666 — an increase of 81 for the previous year — with the top 70 teams advancing to the State Finals at AMF Strike ‘N Spare Lanes in Syracuse on April 30 to determine the four state championship teams. The tournament was followed by a box lunch at the center — a change in our program which, we believe, turned out to be successful. Team scholarships awarded at the luncheon totaled \$7,200.

18th Annual NYS Adult/Junior Tournament (Paul Terracciano, State Tournament Manager)

This tournament was held on the weekend of April 29-May 1 at AMF Strike ‘N Spare lanes in Syracuse in conjunction with the NYS Youth Team Tournament. A total of 290 teams competed — down 11 teams from last year. The teams competed in four classes with nine state champions crowned. This program awarded \$5,000 in scholarships and was a lot of fun for all.

State Youth Committee Meeting

During the weekend, the Youth Committee met and reviewed the season’s results and discussed rule adjustments and changes for the 2017 tournaments.

New York State Pepsi Championships (Nelson Chase, State Tournament Manager)

A total of 9,157 boys and girls participated in the second year of scratch only competition at the league level, with 3,056 advancing to the regional level using the 1:3 ratio. The numbers decreased 129 from the prior season.

Regional bowlers in the U8 and U10 divisions won 120 scholarships at that level. The Pepsi finals for the U12, U15 and U20 division were held May 21 at King Pins Lanes in Rome, with 120 in attendance. Six State Champions were crowned, with four bowlers advancing to Indianapolis. Pepsi Scholarships for 2016 totaled more than \$35,000.

The NYS Youth Leaders did their usual great job as color guard and lanes runners at the team tournament and luncheon. The Youth Leaders held their annual election and elected new officers.
